**Voter Registration and Party Change Deadline for March 19th Elections is
Tuesday, February 20th in Palm Beach County**
Registration Books Close 29 Days Before Any Election

PALM BEACH COUNTY, FL – March 19th is Election Day in Palm Beach County for the 2024 Presidential Preference Primary Election (PPP) and Uniform Municipal Elections.

The deadline to register to vote and/or change party affiliation is Tuesday, February 20, 2024.

Voters already registered are encouraged to verify and, if needed, update their voter registration. Voters not registered to vote or who wish to change their party must do so by February 20, 2024. Voters may change their party affiliation at any time, but it must be done 29 days before a Primary Election to be valid for that election. This can be done:

- Online at www.RegistertoVoteFlorida.gov. Please have your FL Driver License or ID available.
- In person at any of our four offices Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., or other voter registration agencies.
- By mail. Forms are available in person at any of our offices or online at www.VotePalmBeach.gov. Mailed forms must be complete and postmarked by February 20, 2024.

This year, only the Republican Party is holding a PPP in Florida. Florida is a “closed primary” state; therefore, only voters who registered with the Republican Party by February 20, 2024, are eligible to participate in the PPP.

Please note: Some party candidates for president have reportedly suspended or ended their presidential campaigns. If a candidate did not submit a formal withdrawal before December 12, 2023, in accordance with section 103.101(3), Fla. Stat., the candidate nominee’s name must remain on the Presidential Preference Primary (PPP) ballot for his or her respective party. A vote cast for any candidate nominee appearing on the ballot will count as a vote for that candidate.
