Canvassing Board to Conduct Public Test of Election Equipment

PALM BEACH COUNTY, FL – On Monday, February 26, at 1:00 p.m., the Palm Beach County Canvassing Board will meet to oversee a public Logic & Accuracy Test of ballot scanners.

During the test, stacks of pre-filled ballots are scanned through a random selection of ballot scanners that will be used for Early Voting, Vote by Mail, and Election Day voting during the March 19, 2024 Presidential Preference Primary and Municipal Elections to confirm that the scanners are reading every position on the ballot and counting votes accurately.

Elections supervisors are required by Florida law to use election equipment that meets the state's stringent certification standards and to perform this Logic & Accuracy Test before every election. Upon completion, the equipment will be sealed and kept under camera surveillance until being deployed to voting locations.

After the election, the Canvassing Board will oversee a post-election audit to verify the accuracy of reported results. Per the February 1, 2024 Administrative Order 12.504 – 2/2024, the members of the Canvassing Board include County Court Judge April Bristow, County Commissioner Gregg Weiss, Supervisor of Elections Wendy Link, and their alternates.

The Logic & Accuracy Test is open to the public at the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections Voting Equipment Center, 7835 Central Industrial Drive, Riviera Beach, 33404.
